

JOURNEY

The loss of a loved one can be particularly difficult for teenagers. Journey is a special opportunity for youth who have completed the sixth –12th grade and who have experienced the death of a loved one. It is designed for pre-teens and teens who need to express their grief and deal with the emotions that come during the aftermath of loss.

ACTIVITIES

Participants will engage in activities and small group sessions with their peers to help them learn about themselves and their grief. They will be assisted by experienced counselors who are prepared and trained to deal with bereavement issues.

DETAILS

Journey is June 2-3 at Potter Community Center. It lasts from 8 a.m. until 4:30 p.m. each day. Pastors, school counselors, churches and other agencies in the community may also refer potential participants. All applicants will be screened by bereavement counselors for appropriate age grouping.
